## Members of the Becoming Certified Task Force

**Diane L. Gorgas, M.D., Chair.** Dr. Gorgas is a Professor and Vice Chair of Academic Affairs in the Department of Emergency Medicine and Executive Director of the Office of Global Health at The Ohio State University in Columbus, Ohio. She was elected to the ABEM Board in 2018, has served as an oral examiner since 2000, is an editor for the Oral Exam, and has been a question writer for the In-training Examination. Dr. Gorgas's research interests include educational methodologies, global health, disparities of care, women and infant health equity, obstetrical and newborn emergency care. She completed her residency training in Emergency Medicine at the University of Cincinnati.

**Felix K. Ankel, M.D.,** is Vice President for Health Professions Education at HealthPartners Institute, and Professor of Emergency Medicine at the University of Minnesota.
